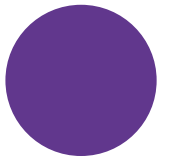

ISPCAN's mission is to **prevent cruelty to children in every nation**, and in every form: physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, street children, child fatalities, child prostitution, children of war, emotional abuse, and child labor.

We are committed to increasing public awareness of all forms of violence against children, developing activities to prevent such violence, and promoting the rights of **children in all regions of the world**.

Violence against children takes many forms, including physical, sexual, and emotional abuse, and may involve neglect or deprivation. Violence occurs in many settings, including the home, school, community and over the Internet. Similarly, a wide range of perpetrators commit violence against children, such as family members, intimate partners, teachers, neighbors, strangers and other children. Such violence not only inflicts harm, pain and humiliation on children; it also kills. All children have the right to protection from violence.

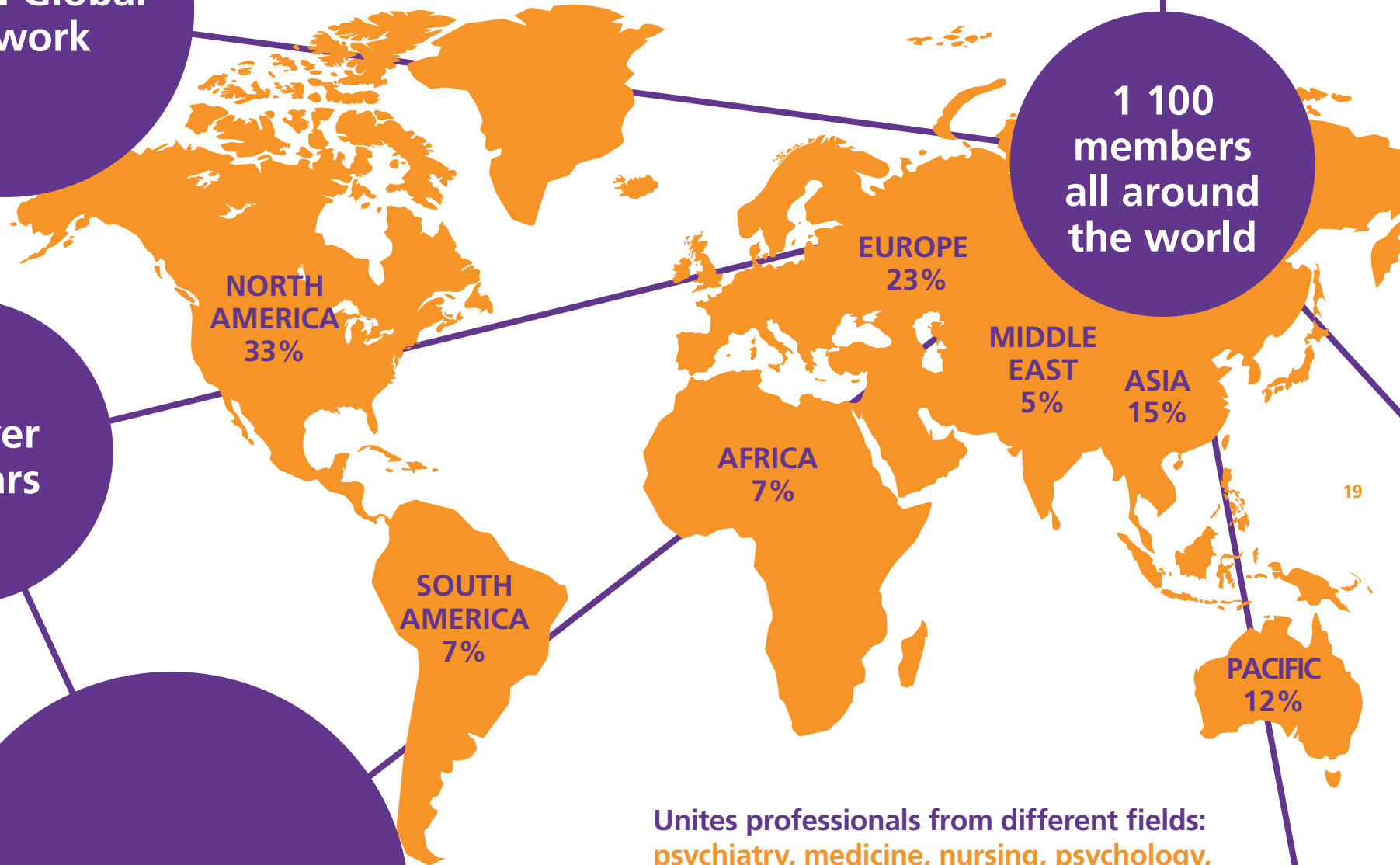

Child Protection in the Czech Republic in Numbers

- 22 000 children live outside their original family (12.9 children out of 1 000 children, which is by one third more compared to other countries).
- 2 200 children under the age of 6 live in an institutional care (in most European countries it is no longer possible to place children of such a young age in institutional care).
- 3 800 children are removed from their families every year and placed in a substitute care due to the collapse of the family unit; state-guaranteed network of social services that would prevent it or would help families improve their situation is non-existing
- The state annually contributes the amount of CZK 4 500 to a social and legal protection of a child; while it contributes around CZK 470 000 for a child in institutional care.
- Courts annually handle over 100 000 cases involving minors in which children need legal protection.

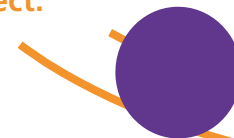
Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE's)

Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE's) is the term given to describe all types of abuse, neglect, and other traumatic experiences that occur to individuals under the age of 18. While studying relationships between these experiences during childhood and reduced health and well-being later in life, following was realized:

- People with six or more ACEs died nearly 20 years earlier on average than those without ACEs.
- Life time costs associated with child maltreatment at 124 billion USD – of which:
 - 83,5 billion PRODUCTIVITY LOSS
 - 25 billion HEALTH CARE
 - 4,6 billion SPECIAL EDUCATION
 - 4,4 billion CHILD WELFARE
 - 3,9 billion CRIMINAL JUSTICE

These wide-ranging health and social consequences underscore the importance of PREVENTING ACEs before they happen.

Child abuse and neglect is a complex issue that affects countless families across the country, regardless of geography, ethnicity, or income. Adverse childhood experiences can not only harm a child while young, but have a significant impact on social and health issues later in life as an adult. Thankfully, safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments are shown to help families thrive and prevent child abuse and neglect.



What Can You Do for the Child Protection Cause?

1. Attract and Retain Talented Employees and Grow the Business?

Supporting family-friendly policies in the workplace can contribute to preventing child abuse and neglect and may also increase employee satisfaction, productivity, commitment to the company, retention, and performance. By getting involved with the community initiative to build safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments, businesses can identify new ways to build their staff and business success. E.g. family-friendly policies can make the company more attractive to potential employees and can be useful for recruiting new talent.

2. Community Stability

Community strength, health, and vibrancy are important considerations for many businesses. If a community sees rises in health problems, violence, and poverty, local businesses may suffer or need to consider relocation.

By joining the initiatives with your company, you are directly contributing to broader community activities to increase resident and business stability, which translates into stronger employee and business productivity.

3. Productivity

When businesses join initiatives to create safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments, they are also working to make their workplaces more productive. By supporting initiatives that value team building activities in the workplace and employee recognition policies and programs to improve workplace relationships, you are also improving the productivity of your own employees in addition to benefitting the community around them. Productivity increases when workers feel valued. When top leaders demonstrate that they support their staff, they influence the behavior of others and set the culture of the organization

Involvement with a meaningful public health initiative has the opportunity to increase a business's exposure to different leaders in the community. 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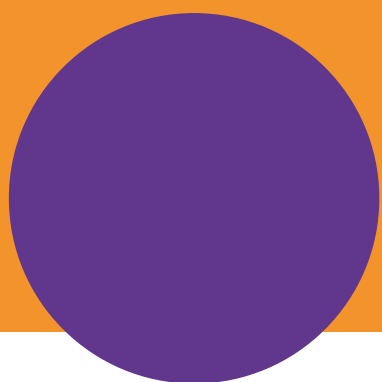
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
